

I have been caught up in the idea of Divine Love for the last six months. I'm not saying that I have a full grasp of it yet, but I press on toward the goal. I want to share a little insight I've had into this thing we call Divine Love and how it can impact our daily life.

I am beginning to believe that these "Aha moments!", these revelations of God's love that we have are glimpses into the reality that Jesus embraced every moment He was on the Earth. He saw reality in a radical way that transformed the world as we know it. He was fearless, and it injected into the consciousness of humanity the idea of Divine unconditional love. We've heard of people having religious experiences where they have a clear understanding of the "oneness" of all things. Our culture often dismisses these experiences because this idea can be so contrary to our everyday experience. It's hard to believe that things as arbitrary as a sunset and the precious smile on my child's face can somehow be connected. I believe, and have experienced, that this is God at work revealing to us and perfecting our idea of what love is and can be in our lives.

To offer an example to help clarify I would like to bring your attention to a man named Pierre Teilhard de Chardin. He was a French Jesuit priest who was also a paleontologist and geologist. He came to believe that love is "the very physical structure of the Universe." For Teilhard things like gravity, the way atoms interact with each other, celestial mechanics, cycles in nature, how plants use sunlight, ecosystems, electromagnetic fields, sexuality, friendships, instinct, and evolution all reveal to us an energy that attracts and brings things together. All of these things are a movement toward life becoming more and more complex and complicated. I'd like for us to think of love in this way, and see that love is the driving force of the universe. It is love that brings the rain, the nudge that makes us go out of our way for others, the very binding of our cells, and the smell of rain on a spring day. Life on this planet is complicated. Going to work every day, loving our neighbor, dealing with medicine and a diagnosis, to loving and raising our children are all ways life can get complicated. None of us can argue that as life becomes more complex the future often seems more and more difficult to discern. Isn't this how we describe responsibility and what growing up means to our kids? Life becomes more complex, and we need to learn how to navigate it. I believe God wants to help us navigate this reality.

I offer this view of love to you in hopes that you will learn to live without fear and in the fullness of what God has for you. 1 John 4:17-19 tells us, "This is how love has been perfected in us, so that we can have confidence on the Judgment Day, because we are exactly the same as God is in this world. 18 There is no fear in love, but perfect love drives out fear, because fear expects punishment. The person who is afraid has not been made perfect in love. 19 We love because God first loved us." What this reveals to me, and I pray in you, is that when we begin to see reality as inherently "good" as God said it is in Genesis, and we begin to see love as the driving force of all things, the world becomes a much safer place to be in. When we live with a fearbased faith, we not only fear God, but we fear the world and all the things in it, including people. God did not give us a spirit of fear and confusion but one of love! This idea of divine love is what I see when I look at the galaxies and stars overhead. It is what I see in my daughter's eyes when she is giggling uncontrollably at naptime. It is the same force. It binds and brings all things together. If we look closely enough we can have a glimpse at the reality Jesus spoke of when he said that the Kingdom is now! We can step boldly into that reality and find that we are never bereft of love, but have access to an infinite source all around us, in all things, and especially in the most unlikely places imaginable. That to me is a very encouraging thought and one I hope you will ponder over this next week! Where have you been surprised to find love and peace in the world?

Bill and Marynell Ford are coordinating this event.


